CMTEL to Pay over \$168,000 to Members

Citizens Mutual Telephone Cooperative is pleased to announce the payment of capital credits to customers who had telephone service during the calendar years of 1995 and/or 2014. The payments were mailed in late May.

The Board of Directors place value on returning a portion of all allocated patronage capital to our more recent or current customers as well as our long standing customers. The total dollar amount of capital credits to be paid out exceeds \$168,000.

Capital credits represent patronage furnished by customers in excess of the cost of providing telephone service. This capital represents an investment in the telephone cooperative by its members and provides funding for capital improvements and operations while helping to reduce reliance on debt financing.

Citizens Mutual Telephone is pleased to return to its customers a portion of their capital investment in the cooperative while continuing to meet our investment goals for improvements.

- **Convenience**—Landline service provides users with many valuable features, such as, automatic callback and three way calling. These are features that may not be available on your wireless phone.
- **Capital Credits**—You are an owner of your local landline provider, Citizens Mutual Telephone Coop. This allows you to receive a return on your investment in the cooperative through yearly capital credit checks. You don't receive this opportunity from your wireless provider.
- **Broadband Services**—Your landline provider has these services that can be accessed easily at home or work on your computer. Some wireless providers don't offer these services and if they do, it is on the small screen of your wireless phone.
- **Friendly, Local Customer Service**—Citizens Mutual, your local landline provider, offers customers courteous and reliable customer service. You don't have to wait on hold for long periods of time to talk to a representative. You can get answers quickly from friendly people you know in your community. We also offer 24/7 tech support.

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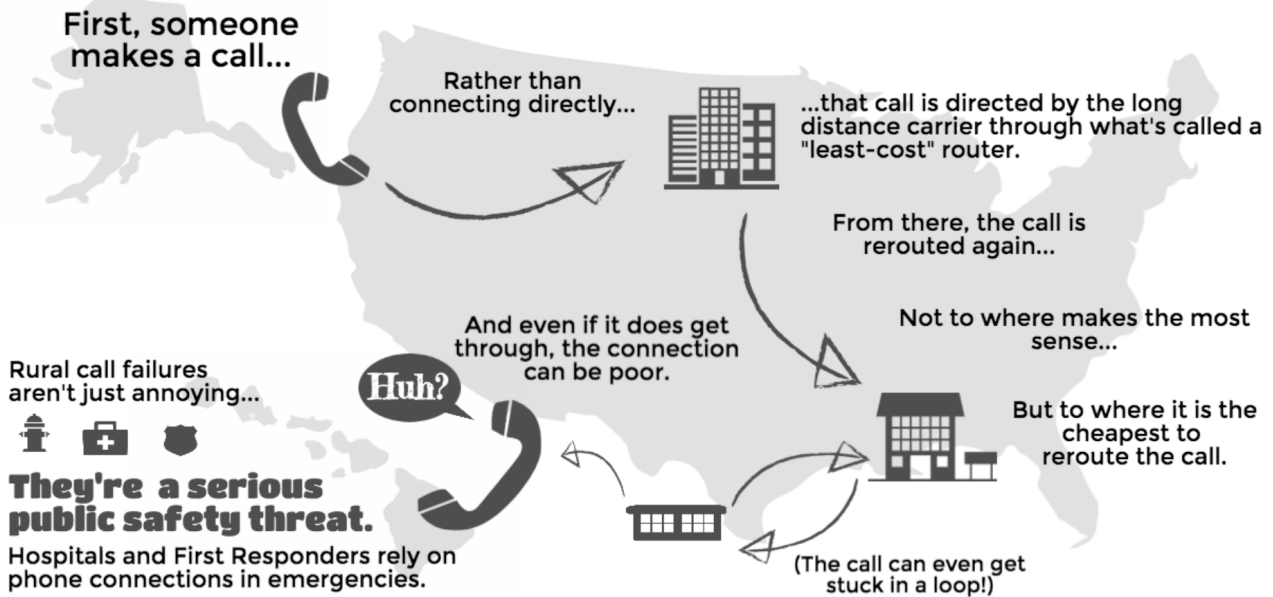
